

Minutes of the 9th W.A.L.G. meeting held at the P.G.A. National Resort & Spa, Florida U.S.A. 29th June 1994.

Present: Doug Crosby Chairman (Australia), Tony Kirkland (England), Jerry Bradley (Ireland), Chimiro Isa (Japan), Neville Lucas (New Zealand), Rolf Ulfvengren (Sweden), Martin Poertner (Germany), John Peng (Taiwan) Tom James (U.S.A.).  
Special invitation to Peter Read (Australia) and Ken Ahrens (U.S.A.).

Time Commenced: 3:30 p.m.

Previous minutes read and adopted - signed by chairman.

Tony Kirkland (England) spoke on England's bid to hold the 1996 Championship to be centered around Southport, 20 miles north of Liverpool. In late July 1996, suggested costs: motorized buggies 10.00 (pounds), caddies 3-4 (pounds), accommodation hotels 50.00 - 80.00 (pounds), bed and breakfast 15.00 - 20.00 (pounds). Temperature 25-27 (summer)  
Note: British open at Lythan St Annes, (nearby) 14-21 of July 1996. Moved Crosby, seconded Ahrens that the 1996 World Championship be held at Southport England in late July 1996 agreed unanimously.

From Jerry Bradley (Ireland) when the WALG decide on a venue for a World Championship that venue should stand.

Bid for the tournament following England 1996 was opened for discussion: Mr Isa (Japan) spoke on a bid for Japan to hold the World Championship in Japan in 1997. He outlined some difficulties that exist but agreed to notify the chairman of a firm proposal by July 1995. Agreed unanimously that the World Championship be held in Japan in September 1997, subject to confirmation in July 1995.

A bid was submitted by Doug Crosby for South Australia in the year 2000. The bid was lost unless it replaces the Tasmania bid in 1998.

A set of guidelines has been prepared by Ken Ahrens to assist each country running a tournament. Guidelines accepted.

Moved Tony Kirkland that the Chairman produce a simple constitution, to be presented in England for discussion - carried.

Election of Chairman: Doug Crosby nominated by Tom James, seconded by Tony Kirkland - no other nominations elected.

Election of Secretary: Ken Ahrens nominated by Tony Kirkland, seconded by Neville Lucas.  
Peter Read nominated by Tom James seconded by Jerry Bradley.  
Peter Read elected.

The Chairman asked that the Constitution have a clause to invite honorary guests to the WALG meetings.

There being no further business the meeting closed at 6:00 p.m.
